Community Thanksgiving Food Collection

Thanksgiving is a wonderful holiday. It is a time to be grateful for all that we have. It is also a time to remember those who may be in need of food. On November 18, resources from the Midland community will come together to provide 550 families with a Thanksgiving meal. This program is a partnership of Aldersgate United Methodist Church, EFPN and the Midland County Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS). The list of recipients is compiled with input from many of the nonprofit agencies in Midland County. To be a part of this event, you may bring your nonperishable food items and personal care items on Sunday, November 18, between 11:00 am and 1:00 pm to Aldersgate United Methodist Church, 2206 Airfield Lane. Many churches in our community are collecting food for this event. If you cannot make it to Aldersgate on November 18, volunteers are available to pick up donations. Please call 839-9879 or 486-9393.

What is Needed:

Food Needs: Canned fruits, vegetables and soups, cereal, spaghetti sauce, noodle, boxed potatoes, rice, dessert mixes, juices, stuffing, canned stews, Jell-O, pie mixes



Personal Care Needs: Shampoo, bar soap, deodorant, combs, hair brushes, razor/shaving cream, toilet paper, tooth paste, tooth brushes, laundry detergent

Cookies: Donations of homemade cookies (labeled and packaged, a dozen per

package in sealed plastic bags) would be especially appreciated. At least 550 dozens of cookies are needed.

Cash Donations: We need almost \$11,000 in cash donations to give recipients gift certificates which the families use to purchase perishable foods. Checks should be made payable to: Midland County EFPN, P.O. Box 2521, Midland, MI 48641-2521. Please designate your donation as Thanksgiving Baskets.

Reflections

A foster family got an unexpected juvenile in their care. They needed help with food to take on this sudden addition to their family.

A couple moved to Midland with a promise of jobs but found there were no jobs. We helped them with food as they look for work.

A young woman attended a wedding with a friend. She noticed her friend was putting food into her purse. The lady said she had no food or money to buy food. The young woman called EFPN for help for her friend.

An elderly man receiving \$575/month from Social Security needed food assistance. He was very upset that he could not afford food. He will be getting an increase in Social Security in a couple of months so hopes to only need assistance till then.

A single mom got behind in her mortgage payment and used her food money to pay her mortgage.

EFPN Senior Delivery Service



There are seniors in our community who are low income and have limited means or mobility to get out to purchase necessities like food. Over 15 years ago EFPN partnered with the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to provide food once a month to low income seniors during the months of October thru May. It was felt that utility bills are higher during these months and these seniors would not have a lot of money left over for food. This senior delivery program was run through the HELP Pantry at Memorial Presbyterian Church. A few years ago, EFPN decided to make this program year round and to expand it. In addition to DHHS, we partnered

with Senior Services to provide us names of homebound low income seniors. Five of our pantries are now involved in providing these boxes- Bullock Creek Outreach Pantry at Messiah Lutheran Church, Coleman Railway Center Pantry, HELP Pantry, SAMS Pantry sponsored by St. John's Episcopal Church and Wheeler Road Church of Christ Pantry. We have a dedicated group of volunteers who deliver food or Ensure medical supplement to around 20 households each month. Themed cards have been a special addition to these boxes. Families with children looking for a way to volunteer are making cards each month. Sometimes we think the visit by the volunteers and the cards mean more to the seniors than the food itself. Thank you to all our supporters and volunteers. Without your help we could not continue this program that brings a little sunshine into the lives of these seniors.

The Impact of Monetary Donations

EFPN greatly appreciates all donations of food, personal care and cleaning supplies. However, monetary support is also crucial for our programs.

Last year over 215,000 items were distributed from our eight pantries. Just over half of these items were donated. We are able to stretch your donated dollars by buying food from the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan (FBEM). We supplement items from FBEM with local purchases in order to fully stock our pantries. Last year we spent \$82,899 on purchased items. Donated deer provides venison for our clients, costing EFPN almost \$6000 for processing fees. In addition to food, we provided our clients \$51,000 in gift certificates to purchase items not available at the pantries.

The Backpack Buddies program provides a weekend backpack of food for children who qualify for free and reduced price lunches. For the 2017-2018 school year we had over 700 elementary and preschool students enrolled. EFPN purchases the food for this program from the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan. We add locally purchased fruit once a month to the backpacks. The cost for this program is \$83,900.

Our Medical Nutrition program provides vouchers for a nutritional supplement, like Ensure or Boost, to clients who are referred to us by Cancer Services, Senior Services and DaVita Dialysis. Our costs for this program have gone up because of our expanded Senior Delivery Service. This program also provides vouchers for specialty formulas needed by some babies.

The 2018 budget for this program is \$26,500.

A mobile pantry costs around \$1400. Most of our mobile pantries are funded by churches and individuals, however EFPN provides around \$350.00 in funding to supplement each mobile pantry truck. Even though we receive a lot of food donations for the Thanksgiving programs, we need to purchase additional items. We also provide recipients gift certificates to purchase perishable items. The Thanksgiving Program requires around \$15,000 in EFPN funds

EFPN has established a number of partnerships in which we provide boxes of food to agencies like Habitat for Humanity, Home To Stay Housing Assistance Center and Midland Community Former Offenders Advocacy and Rehabilitation. We also are helping to stock the pantries at Windover High School and the Academic & Career Education Academy. These partnerships require around 9000 food items. We frequently purchase many of the items for these partnerships because we often do not have the quantities needed in our inventory.

We are very grateful to all our supporters for trusting us with your donations and are constantly striving to keep our administration costs low. Kathy Calvin, President of the United Nations Foundation, said, "Giving is not just about making a donation. It is about making a difference." We hope you know that your donations are making a difference and having an impact on the food insecure in our community. Your continued support will allow us to maintain and expand our outreach to the food insecure.



SNAP: Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program

SNAP is America's anti-hunger program, helping 1 in 8 Americans afford a basic diet. Two thirds of recipients are children, seniors and people with disabilities. Most working age SNAP recipients work but often in unstable jobs or low paying jobs with few benefits like sick leave. Despite providing modest benefits, averaging about \$1.40 per person per meal, the SNAP program combats food insecurity, alleviates poverty and has long-term positive impact on health as well as on children's educational attainments. All households (except those with elderly or disabled members) must pass a gross income test (130 percent of poverty) to qualify for SNAP benefits. For example, a family of 4 cannot have a gross monthly income greater than \$2,665 to qualify for SNAP. SNAP benefits cannot be used to buy personal care or cleaning products, diapers or paper products. The federal government pays 100 percent of SNAP benefits. Federal and state governments share administrative costs (with the federal government contributing nearly 50 percent). SNAP is administered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

We Have a Home

EFPN has signed a purchase agreement for our current building, 503 S Saginaw Rd. The building is in need of extensive renovations. Expansion by EFPN into additional available rooms will provide needed warehouse space for donations of food for our eight pantries and food purchased for our Backpack Buddies Program. Additional temperature controlled space will also improve the storage of fresh produce. Reconfiguration of the spaces will improve handicap accessibility for clients to the SAMS pantry and the flow of food throughout the facility. We are grateful to all who supported this effort including grants from The Allen Foundation, The Dow Corning Foundation, The Midland Area Community Foundation, and The Rollin M Gerstacker Foundation. We currently have 50-60% of the funds necessary for the purchase and renovation. SAMS Pantry, sponsored by St. John's Episcopal Church will continue to rent space in the building. We have applied for additional grants but your financial help will drive down our loan amount and allow us to devote our resources to our food programs.

Sharing Tree Online Impact Store





EFPN provides birthday kits to recipients who have an upcoming birthday. EFPN is experiencing a shortage of these kits. These kits were initially given only to children, but we decided that everyone deserves something special for their birthday-especially those who have very little to begin with or are going through a difficult period. Grandparents are often delighted to have a kit to make a cake for their grandchild. In 2017, EFPN gave out 529 birthday kits. The minimum items for a kit are cake mix, frosting and candles. Our donors have been very creative and generous in assembling these kits. They have included items such as birthday plates, napkins or cups, a birthday card and even a baking pan.
